
# A Vigil of Lament and Comfort for a Grieving Community

#### A Vigil of Lament and Comfort for a Grieving Community

Tonight's Vigil of Lament and Comfort for a Grieving Community will create a dedicated time and place for community members to gather and collectively acknowledge the sudden, tragic death of Sheila Stanton.

The primary purpose of the vigil is to allow the community to mourn together. A public vigil provides a powerful way for people to support each other and realize they are not alone in their grief. This shared experience can be incredibly healing.

This service will last approximately 30 minutes.

Following the worship service, all are welcome to Marsh Hall for light refreshments and to participate in a guided discussion facilitated by Greg Malone. Greg is a licensed therapist and minister with 30 years' experience helping communities and congregations process traumatic loss.

This time of conversation offers each of us the chance to express our pain and grief in ways that can be heard, witnessed, and received by the gathered community in helpful and healing ways. Participation in this conversation is completely optional.

The primary focus of tonight's vigil is not to memorialize Sheila. Rather, it is to try and process her sudden and tragic loss, so that when we come together to celebrate her life on Saturday, September 20, at 11:00 a.m., we will be in a better place to honor and remember

#### A Collect of Lament

Please stand as you are able

Gracious God, we come before you this day in pain and sorrow. We grieve the loss of Sheila Stanton, mother, sister, niece and cousin, friend, mentor, colleague and community leader: a beloved child of your making. Give your grace to all who are gathered together this night in our grief and shock. Bless and comfort all who are sorely grieved by Sheila's death. Hear the cries of our hearts at the sudden and tragic nature of her death. That by your grace, and in comforting presence with others we may find consilation and be strengthened by your Spirit embodied in tonight's gathering. All this we pray in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

#### A Reading from Holy Scripture

Lamentations 1.12, 16a,b; 3.19,21-26,31-33

Reader: A reading from the Book of Lamentations.

Is it nothing to you, all you who pass by? Look and see if there is any sorrow like my sorrow, which was brought upon me, which the Lord inflicted on the day of his fierce anger. For these things I weep; my eyes flow with tears; for a comforter is far from me, one to revive my courage. Remember my affliction and my bitterness, the wormwood and the gall! But this I call to mind, and therefore I have hope: The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases, his mercies never come to an end; They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. 'The Lord is my portion,' says my soul, 'therefore I will hope in him.' The Lord is good to those who wait for him, to the soul that seeks him. It is good that we should wait quietly for the salvation of the Lord. For the Lord will not reject for ever; though he causes grief, he will have compassion, according to the abundance of his steadfast love; for he does not willingly afflict or grieve anyone.



To symbolize the light she brought into our lives, and to affirm her continuing life in God, I invite you to come forward, recieve a beeswax taper, light it from central candle, and place it among the others as you depart.

We leave Sheila's light burning in this holy place. May we trust that though we no longer see Sheila, her light continues to shine brightly in the place beyond this life.
